In addition to needing verification of the information above, before we can award the grant funds, you must submit to the U.S. Department of Education (Department) an application that meets all applicable requirements and is consistent with the purpose(s) of the grant that is contained in the Omnibus Appropriations Act of 2022. This application must be submitted through [Grants.gov](https://grants.gov)

We encourage you to begin familiarizing yourself with Grants.gov. After accessing the home page, we recommend that first time users of the system go to the "Learn Grants" tab to the right of the "Home" tab to watch a short video to learn how to register for a user ID and

password. The “Learn Grants” tab also includes a variety of resources to help users successfully submit a grant application.
